Guest Speakers/Special Guests

[Jeff Thamkittikasem – Director of the NYC Mayor's Office of Operations] COVID Testing in Schools – Highlights:

• Main objective of testing is to catch trends in order to adjust protocols and highlight areas that require attention.

• Throughout the entire process, it was consistently found that positivity rates were low (.82%).

• Provides good view of the entire system along with individual schools using indicators to react accordingly.

- Weekly testing
 - Random selection of 20% of students and staff.
 - Team travels to the school to conduct testing.
 - Separate rooms are set up in schools for testing.
 - PCR nasal swabs used for testing. Reports results within 48 hours.
- Privacy protocol on samples- kept for one week in case there are concerns, and then they are discarded.
- Results- brought to the lab, processed and uploaded to portal where they will do their best to contact those who have a positive result.

- Focus of Comptroller Scott M. Stringer's office:
 - Ensuring that parents have as many opportunities as possible to opt into in person learning.

- Equity and access for students in temporary housing. Many students are still without internet access.
- Expansion of College Now as opposed to cutting school budgets.
- Making college more economically accessible and ensuring two year college is tuition free.
- Working on the budget cuts to the Sanitation department.

[Cynthia Schneider – Queens South High School Superintendent, Acting] Highlights:

- D28 is the highest performing district in all of Queens South.
 - ✤ 4-year graduation rate 91.65%
 - ✤ 4-year college readiness 75.79%
 - CCPCI (Advanced courses; credit for College Now) 71.83%
- Goals for D28
 - Improve graduation rates and college readiness
 - Concentrate on social and emotional learning
 - Improve literacy across all grades
 - Improve remote learning
 - ◆ Working to ensure there is good assessment data in the absence of testing
- High School Application
 - Currently there is no due date, however parents and students should start thinking about the kind of school they want to go to. Considerations include clubs/teams, travel, school size, special programs, etc.
