## **Superintendent's Report**

- 1) Attendance Update
  - ❖ Upload rate 100%
  - Daily attendance rate 91%
  - **❖** In person 89.7%
  - Remote attendance rate 91%
- 2) COVID positivity rate
  - ❖ 10.17% 7 day average in Queens − D28 hopes to continue to protect and secure very low transference of the virus within school buildings to keep schools open
- 3) Admissions Update
  - ❖ Middle School application will open during the week of January 11<sup>th</sup>
  - High Schools are encouraged to create diversity plans for admissions, but are not required to change any of their screening or admissions processes

- ❖ National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP)- 3 year grant with the goal to increase the number of students with access to much needed technology and to utilize learning software to enable students to improve learning skills. D28 provided with 850 Chromebooks to 15 schools, including Pre-K centers.
- Girls Who Game Tech based program designed to captivate female students in grades4-8. Two clubs offered with 10 students per club.
- Teaching Matters In collaboration with Superintendent Dr. Tammy Pate, 10 schools selected to train teachers on how to support struggling readers in grades Kindergarden-1<sup>st</sup> grade.
