Mission and Vision



GET RICHER!

While being R.I.C.H.E.R

While being **respectful** you are showing good manners, and may also be illustrating **compassion** (sympathy) towards others. **Integrity** is the quality of being **honest** and having strong moral principles. To be **empowered** is to be stronger and confident. If you are morally accountable for your behaviors, you are being **responsible**.

EXAMPLES OF BECOMING RICHER:

Respect: Respect the ears of those around you (ex: no yelling, exhibit appropriate language, stay silent when someone else is speaking)/Obey rules/Encourage respect to others

Integrity: Returning lost items/Be true to yourself & others/Admitting mistakes/ Being a team player. Keep your eyes on your own paper, when someone wants to copy your work, politely explain that it isn't right and that it's best to do your own work.

Compassion: Help others clean-up/Help others who are in need (ex: carrying items, holding door, someone who is injured)/Being a friend to someone who needs a little extra TLC/Be empathetic/Help a peer who is struggling in class. Sincerely compliment others.

Honesty: Accept responsibility for your own actions; don't blame others. Do your own homework, Tell the truth when you've done something wrong. Express your real feelings without anger, without blaming others, without exaggerating, and without hurting the feelings of someone else. Genuinely celebrate others achievements.

Empowered: Defending a friend/Being a leader (not a follower)/Practice what you have learned/Every class can teach you about something- Inquire about something new/Challenge yourself to go above and beyond. Do your best when homework, project or any other responsibility has been given to you.

Responsibility: Admitting mistakes/Apply responsible decision making/Think before acting/Taking Accountability/Being trustworthy/Being able to do something without being told or reminded to do it.




